

CONFESSION OF FAITH: Heidelberg Catechism Lord's Day 28

- 75 Q. How does the Lord's Supper show you and assure you that you share in Christ's one sacrifice on the cross and in all his gifts?
- 75 A. In this way: That Christ has commanded me and all believers to eat this bread and drink this cup, and joined to his command these promises: First, as surely as I see with my eyes the bread of the Lord broken for me and the cup given for me, so surely was his body offered for me, and his blood shed for me on the cross. Second, as surely as I receive from the hand of the one who serves, and taste with my mouth the bread and cup of the Lord, given to me as sure signs of Christ's body and blood, so surely does he himself nourish and refresh my soul for eternal life with his crucified body and shed blood.
- 76 Q. What does it mean to eat the crucified body of Christ and to drink his shed blood?
- 76 A. It means to accept with a believing heart all the sufferings and the death of Christ, and by believing to receive forgiveness of sins and eternal life. But it also means to be so united more and more to Christ's blessed body through the Holy Spirit, who lives both in Christ and in us, that, although he is in heaven and we are on earth, nevertheless we are flesh of his flesh and bone of his bone, and live and are governed forever by the one Spirit, as members of our body are by one soul.
- 77 Q. Where does Christ promise to nourish and refresh believers with his body and blood as surely as they eat this bread and drink this cup?

.

77 A. In the institution of the Lord's Supper, which reads as follows:

The Lord Jesus on the night he was betrayed took bread, and when he had given thanks he broke it and said, "This is my body, which is for you; do this in remembrance of me." In the same way after supper he took the cup, saying, "This cup is the new covenant in my blood; do this, whenever you drink it, in remembrance of me." For whenever you eat this bread and drink this cup, you proclaim the Lord's death until he comes.

This promise is repeated by Paul in these words: Is not the cup of thanksgiving for which we give thanks a participation in the blood of Christ? And is not the bread that we break a participation in the body of Christ? Because there is one loaf, we, who are many, are one body, for we all partake of the one loaf.
